Tom Hubbard

Florida

Secretary

Tyler Herreman has been an avid bowler and an integral part of his family run center, Centennial Lanes, for the last 20 plus years. He has worked diligently to promote the sport of bowling not only in his own community, but on the state and national levels as well.

In 2010 Tyler was inducted into the Hays Bowling Association Hall of Fame, which at the time, made him the youngest person to have been inducted. He served in every officer position on the Kansas State Bowling Proprietors' Association (KSBPA) including as its President from 2012-2014. Tyler served as Chairman of the KSBPA Nominating Committee and KSBPA Membership Committee and continues to serve on both committees. He is currently Chairman of the KSBPA Beverage Committee. In 2014 he was awarded the Meritorious Service Award by the KSBPA.

At the national level, Tyler has been a member of the BPAA Membership Committee since 2013; he also served as Chairman of the BPAA Small Market Committee from 2015-2018. He is currently the Chairman of the BPAA Governance Committee as well as having served on the BPAA Nominating Committee in 2017-2018. Treasurer

Brian Borowski has been in the bowling business for over 35 years. After earning his BS degree from the State University of New York at Buffalo in Business Management with concentrations in Finance and Management Information Systems, Brian began working with Brunswick as an Assistant Manager and then as a GM. After three years he was promoted to Internal Auditor and was responsible for auditing the P&Ls and implementing cost controls within 120 bowling centers around the U.S. and Canada.

In 1994 Brian purchased his first center in Des Moines, Iowa, and served as President of the Des Moines Proprietors' Association. In 1998 he sold his center and purchased Sunset Bowl in Pueblo, Colorado, and then Ideal Lanes in Canon City, Colorado, in 2000.
